5. Survivor Assistance Information

2003 REUNION

The 2003 Reunion will be held from 11 to 14 September, at the Wyndham Greenpoint Hotel in Houston, Texas. The hotel is located on the north side of Houston near the intersection of Interstate 45 and Sam Houston Parkway at 12400 Greenspoint Drive. It is close to George Bush Intercontinental Airport and the hotel will provide free shuttle service from the airport to the hotel. Reservations can be made by calling the Wyndham Reservation Center at 1-800-WYNDHAM or at www.wyndham.com and identifying yourself as a member of the 281st AHC Association. The rates for a standard room are \$79.00 per night single or double and \$89.00 for triple or quad. King Suites are available at \$89.00 single or double and \$99.00 for triple or quad. For those of you with RV's, campers, etc. the hotel will allow you to park them on site.

The Advance Party will arrive on Thursday, 9/11. This will consist of the Executive Board (EB), selected members of the Reunion Committee and anyone else who wants to get started early. There will be a meeting of the EB that evening at 1900. Friday is arrival and registration day. There will be time for golf that afternoon for anyone who would like to participate, provided someone will step up and take charge of

setting up the golf. If you are interested, please contact me. There will be a Welcome Get Together in the main lobby from 1700-1900. Dinner will be on your own with old friends.

Saturday we will have the Annual Meeting from 0900 to 1100 followed by lunch from 1200-1400. The Remembrance Observance will be from 1530 to 1630. There will be a Reception at 1830 followed by a sit-down dinner at 1930. We are still working on the menu, but it will be something special and there will be a choice of a meat or a fish. After Dinner we will have our Awards Ceremony. The room will be available for informal get togethers until 2400. After that you can use the Lobby bar for socializing. Sunday will be departure day.

If you fly into Bush IAP the hotel will provide free shuttle service. If you fly into Hobby IAP you will have to rent a car, pay for a cab (about \$65.00) or take the free shuttle to Bush IAP and then the free shuttle to the hotel. There is plenty of on-site parking for those who drive their own vehicle. There are two restaurants in the hotel and several more within easy walking distance. There is also extensive shopping in the vicinity. There is lots of space in the lobby for informal meetings and BS Sessions. In addition to the main meeting room we have another room for registration, memorabilia sales and informal get-togethers. We may also have some vendors there. Our on-site coordinators are investigating the possibility of getting busses/vans for shopping and other tours on Friday and for the Ladies on Saturday morning. More later

Voting

In order to vote in this year's election, you must be a member-in-good-standing, meaning that your dues must be paid and up

to date. This includes nominations and appointments.

In accordance with the By-Laws, Article V, Sections 1 thru 7, the following will be in effect for this year's election:

The following positions will be filled during this years voting process:

Vice President - JM@L - Secretary

The 2003 Membership Election schedule is as follows:

- Nominations need to be into the JM@L by NLT 11 Jun 2003 (90 Days).
- Ballots to be mailed NLT 11 Jul 2003 (60 Days).
- All ballots are to be postmarked NLT 11 Aug 2003 in order to be counted (30dys).

Should a position to be filled be uncontested, the individual who declared for or was nominated for the position shall be considered to be elected by acclamation.

Should all of the positions to be filled are uncontested, the JM@L will mail/email the slate of officers to the membership and declare the election complete and make his official report at the GMM

As the above described election procedure will be available to all members, regardless of their location, there will be no provision for proxy voting. Accordingly there will be no provision for an election of officers during the General Membership Meeting.

Should no one qualify or seek an open position during the above described nomination and election process the newly elected President, subject to the approval of the Executive Board, shall appoint a member in good standing to the open position(s) at the first meeting of the newly elected Executive Board.

Flight: I have received several inquiries as to the financial condition of your association and I am pleased to tell you that our highly paid CPA has completed the financial statement for 2002 and submitted it to the Executive Board. Our net income for 2002 was \$6,416.38 for 2002 as compared to \$3,225.89 for 2001. Our total Liabilities and Equity increased from \$11,937.46 in 2001 to \$18,720.39 in 2002. Of interest in the statement is the increase of \$1,075.00 in new membership funds over 2001. We need to work on this area as our new membership numbers are significantly down for the YTD 2003. Please respond to Gary Stagman's request for help and let's all find at least one new member this year.

In the same area as new membership we are lagging behind in the payment of membership dues for 2003. If you have not yet sent your '03 dues to Gary Stagman please do so as soon as you can as we face some advance expenditures for the upcoming reunion. We are planning the reunion as a self supporting event but there are expenses that we must pay in advance. Remember, if you attended a reunion in the past the challenge is to come back and bring at least one new person with you.

The planning and advance work for the reunion continues with Lynn Coleman and company doing a great job getting ready for Houston. Hi LaRie,

If I'm not mistaken, you are staying in the Greenspoint Area (Beltway 8 North & I45). Close to the hotel is a seafood restaurant: Jimmy G's (281 - 931-7654), 307 North Belt (good seafood, Cajun gumbo. His family has been in the business for years). Pappas Seafood House (281-999-9928), 11301 I-45 North (This restaurant is South of the North Belt just 1 exit). Saltgrass Steak House (281 - 872-4545), 14909 I-45 North (This restaurant is North of the Belt on I45 a few exits, maybe 2 or 3 exits). Pappasitos, (281 - 821-4500), 15280 I45 North (across from the Saltgrass and has good Mexican food - very large portions. These restaurants are middle of the road as far as price goes. They all have a lot of customers because you get quality food every time.

There are some fast food restaurants all around the Greenspoint Shopping Center Area. There is a Bennigans right there at the Belt & Imperial Valley (Imperial Valley runs behind the Center I think). Also out by the Saltgrass Steak house is a Joe's Crab Shack.

During the day, if you didn't want to go too far from the Hotel, about 5 miles North of the Belt on I45, you can exit and go to a place called Old Town Spring. They have all kinds of specialty shops out there, tea rooms & burger places. I think some of the burger places have a band on the weekends

If you wanted to venture a little farther - Harwin Drive is a place that has all kinds of stuff for low, low prices. I go to a place called Park Imports at 9889 Harwin and they have tons (I mean tons) of earrings, necklaces & bracelets. I've bought the most beautiful earrings out there for \$2.50, bracelets for \$2.50 - \$3.00. You can't believe the prices. And across the street from Park Imports there are shops that sell purses, nice purses for \$20. It is a haven for finding lots of quality looking things for pennies

And, of course, there is always Kehma, Texas. It is south on I45 like you were going to Galveston. It has lots of restaurants on the waterfront and they have some rides for kids and a

train that goes all around the place. It would probably take you about an hour to get there from your Hotel. You would also pass right by the Space Center on Nassa Road One.
