Just a quick informational note concerning SOAR Registration Forms and Membership.

Sadly to say, NOT all members of the 281stAHC are eligible to become SOA members for various reasons. This is the one that raises the most questions and concerns - To become a SOA member (General or Associate Member) an individual has to have flown for, or participated in missions that are of a SOG nature, NAMELY for the 281st it's DELTA missions - of which

the 281st stopped flying after 1-1-70. With a few exceptions, almost all SF missions outside of DELTA were NOT considered SOG / SOA missions.

NOW to my point : For those who DO NOT qualify to become SOA members (or do not desire to do so) you need to have A SPONSOR when registering with SOA as A GUEST. The sponsor needs to be a CURRENT / PAID UP SOA member, and also needs to be in attendance at SOAR. For those of us who meet these qualifications, I feel sure that any of us will be more than happy to be listed as YOUR SPONSOR on the SOA Registration Form.

Remember, if you are NOT registered with the SOA as well as the 281st, you will NOT be allowed admission into ANY of the SOA areas or functions (including the free bar)

When the time comes to fill out the SOA Registration Form, or if you have questions - call, email, or snail me and if I don't have the answer - I'LL GET IT FOR YOU !
