As it now stands an in country search crew is funded for a set number of days and when that time expires, no matter what they are finding, they are removed and rescheduled for a subsequent year. 

Fred,

It is absolutely true that one never knows what tomorrow holds. After more than forty four years since returning from Viet Nam, I thought that the connection to that time had diminished and waned to a very distant blurred memory.

Then I read the newsletter and the tribute to "Tubby" Brudwig. I didn't meet "Tubby" while in Viet Nam and none of it really registered until I read the words ..."his ship 004 "Death Merchant" ... that a slew of memories came gushing forth. I suddenly felt an enormous kinship and closeness with this man I had never met.

You see, "004 Death Merchant" was my ship also, I flew on it some ten months, if memory serves me right, I named it and I painted it. It was a great ship as it pulled us out many scrapes and always brought us home safely. Judging by the dates, "Tubby" most likely was my successor in the right rear seat, as I left in early May of '69. I am glad and proud that a man of that caliber continued our fight and brought such honor to the 281st.

If you can, please relay my message to him along with my best wishes in his latest battle. All the best.
