The Veep.....

As Vice President for 2011 and 2012, my primary job is to Chair the Reunion Planning Committee. This year the committee is putting together a reunion that we think you will not want to miss. It is scheduled for August 1st - 4th in St. Louis, and in addition to the no charge hospitality suite and our other activities, there are two key features this reunion will be built around, as described below.

First, we are bringing in a professional entertainer for an after dinner show following our Friday night buffet. Tim Richison is a magician who also infuses a little comedy and audience participation into his act. He has performed all over the country at all types and sizes of events, including military reunions, and promises a special finale to his show. The good news is that this show will be at no charge to you and with no increase in the reunion registration fee from last year. It will be well worth coming to St. Louis to see.

Friday night will be fun, but we think Saturday evening will be the center of attention for the entire reunion. The closing banquet on Saturday is always the grand finale, and this year we have a guest speaker who will really make it special. He is Bill Robinson, who was a POW in North Viet Nam, but not just any POW - Bill was one of the very few enlisted men held in North Viet Nam. Most US prisoners there were officers, either jet pilots or rear seat riders. Bill, however, was a

crew chief on an Air Force HH 43, "Husky" helicopter. Shot down over North Viet Nam in September 1965, the crew was captured and held until 1973, thus making Bill the longest held enlisted POW in United States history. Upon being released, Bill was promoted to Captain by President Richard Nixon. He remained in the Air Force until his retirement, and today speaks at service schools and other events, and participates in many former POW related activities around the country. His will be a compelling story.

The weekend nights, therefore, are going to be great, but there are also other reunion activities. Thursday is arrival day for most, and for those interested, we'll go over to Harrah's Casino for dinner as a group at the famous Charlie Gitto's restaurant. Transportation will be provided, and the same fine Italian cuisine will be served as in the original Charlie's in downtown St. Louis. Harrah's has a large hotel and nine different restaurants in addition to the Casino. You don't have to gamble; you don't even have to go into the Casino, but strolling through after dinner and watching the action could be some interesting entertainment. Of course for those who want to try your luck, you can stay and gamble as long as you like. We don't have to return as a group; the Casino throughout the evening provides free transportation back to the hotel.

Daytime activities that can be selected on Friday will be either the local winery tour or a tour of Busch Stadium, the home of the World Series champion St. Louis Cardinals baseball team. If neither of those interest you, St. Louis offers many sights and activities that can be done either individually or in a small group. Help will be available to make arrangements and set up transportation for any of those activities.

Finally, for this year there is the prospect of having some members of the G Company Intruders with us at the reunion. It's not confirmed yet, but these are men from the 2-10 AVN BN, 10th CAB, 10th Mountain Division, our namesake Company, who were deployed to Afghanistan last year. If some are able join us, they should give us an interesting perspective on what is happening over there, and maybe give us some good new war stories to boot.

All in all it's going to be a great reunion this year. Save the date reminders were sent out earlier this month, and I hope you were able to make space on your calendar to attend. Your

registration packet containing the registration form and full reunion details will come out around April 1st. The packets will be distributed via email this year rather than by regular mail as in the past. Please check your email carefully in early April and don't delete the registration information as just another piece of spam or junk mail. If we do not have an email address for you, your packet will be sent via the postal service as always.

The reunion committee is working hard, but remember the thing that really makes the reunion a success is all of you – just everyone being there and reuniting once again. All the other stuff is good, but getting together to celebrate who we were, what we did, how we did it, and to remember those we lost and have lost since is what it is all about. Let's do it again.

The Scribe speaks of Reunions.....

It's October of 1968 and I was a newly winged US Army Aviator and I knew exactly what to do, how to do it, and where I wanted to go, which was Vietnam and singlehandedly win the war. 2 weeks after graduation I arrived, and the 281st was so happy to see me that I sat in Dong Ba Thin for 3 days waiting on transportation. When they finally sent an aircraft the AC (Buck Yancey) tried to make us duck so we wouldn't get shot by some sniper firing .50 calibers at traveling Hueys.

After a day or so of checking in the pilots began making their way back from the Delta operation they were on and we began the process of meeting people in charge and getting our final assignments. And it came to pass that I met MAJ Miller, the CO. Lots of people have had lots to say about MAJ Miller but I never had a problem

with him over there, he brought me into his office and told me what to expect, what he wanted me to do and even who to watch out for. He never mentioned any names but he did say there were a few pilots who tended to, shall we say, bend the rules a bit including one with a propensity for stressing the airframe limits, and sure enough on my first flight this guy tried to make me slide my strapped-in-butt right out of the seat demonstrating an approach and I said to myself "This must be the guy." But even then I realized that he knew tons more than I did, and he had made it through the year so perhaps I needed to pay attention. Then I flew with this short, round guy who talked a blue streak and demonstrated to me that I had a long way to go. That guy is still talking today by the way, I think he was born to be a preacher.

After a year which included many Recondo missions, a move to Wolf Pack and 5 Delta deployments sandwiched around a way too short trip to Australia it was time to come home. The 281st sent us home the same we arrived, by telling us we could wait for an aircraft which may or may not get us there in time or we could ride in a truck. We took the truck and looking back that was the scariest ride of the entire year, but we got there early and my truck buddy was the same guy who had convinced me 12 months earlier to come to the 281st instead of the 155th (don't ask), the same guy who knew the manifest officer at Cam Ranh Bay and got us on the freedom bird a day early, the same guy who was a groomsman in my wedding but doesn't remember (I think we got him drunk).

A year later we and everyone else I knew went our separate ways, never to meet again I thought. But...Reunions, who would have thought 35 years later or so we'd be having reunions, so now most of us meet at least once a year. We keep losing intruders every year, that is not good, but that is one thing that keeps me coming back to St. Louis.

We have a Reunion Committee now, they have been working hard, at their own expense, so give them your support, they've come up with a plan based on your input. We owe them at least a pat on the back. And remember, our bank account is pretty full and the last man standing gets the residual, but not if you don't show up.

From the Editor.... Every two years or thereabouts I republish an excerpt from the December 1998 Newsletter #3 explaining "where we came from". The full text can be read in the website Newsletter archive.

The formation of a 281st Association has caught fire, to the point where there appears to be more and more folks that are unaware of the initial efforts and intent I'd like to take this opportunity to give a little history of how the most recent effort came about.

At the Ft Worth annual reunion of the Viet Nam Helicopter Pilots Association (VHPA) about 18 former 281st pilots got together for a little mini reunion At that gathering we decided to attempt to put together an association There were volunteers for temp positions and the hat was passed for initial operating costs. I ended up the "Secretary Pro-Tem" and also "Editor" of the newsletter It was emphasized from the very first that the association would be "FOR ALL FORMER PERSONNEL OF THE 281ST ASSAULT HELICOPTER COMPANY AND SUPPORT ELEMENTS" and that's the way it will be. It was the general consensus that the initial organizing would be at VHPA gatherings as the most convenient and appropriate way to get things started (I don't think any of us anticipated how quickly and with what enthusiasm the project would "take-off", I mean Zoooom!). Just take a look at our email list, and that's not considering what's likely happening in snail mail land) And we decided that the VHPA 1999 Reunion at Nashville would be the time and the place to constitute the association, vote for officers, charter and what-all. Although the reunion at Nashville is a pilot affair, nothing that I know of precludes ANYONE from coming to the mini-reunion or to the reunion in general Of course the program events and functions are VHPA only.

So, the 281st Mini-Reunion at the Renaissance Hotel, at 1100hrs on the 4th of July, is OPEN TO ALL 281st!

And that's how it all came about. We've come a long way, Intruders. Hoorah!
