The Tampa chapter of the VHPA acquired ship 113 from the government after it had been declared surplus. The ship will be restored to museum display quality and put on display at the H.E.A.R.T.S. Veterans Museum in Huntsville, Texas. Fellow Intruder Ed Duke, Nov 66 to September 67, is heading the restoration. Ship 113 was the first H

model Huey assigned to the 281st in January of 1968. The EB passed a motion to donate monies to the project along with donations from the 281st Associations members. The plan is to replace the missing parts, repaint the ship in the original paint scheme it had while it was with the 281st. You may still donate to the museum at the following address. Long story short I ended up with Janie and we got married 9 months later, moved away 1 month after the wedding and never wanted to come back.

Since our last reunion we have received notices of death for three former Intruders and one honorary member. There are probably more that we do not know about?

Recently the president of the VHPA devoted his letter to the membership on this subject. In his writings he stated that the VHPA would lose over 600 individuals in the next year. While it would be possible to statically compare their size to ours and predict a number, it is enough to simply say that the clock is ticking for all of us.

This is a simple reminder that now is the time to put your affairs in order and it is not that big of a job.

1. Make a will.

2. Formalize your final arraignments with your local funeral director. (All of us can be buried in a military cemetery and for those of us who choose cremation our remains and those of our wives can be placed in Arlington National Cemetery as Arlington now takes the cremated remains of any individual who served in the military and there is a full military honors service.)

3. Put your records and military information in order and tell your wife where they are located. (I have a folder that I keep on my desk that says "I Be Gone".) Not a lot of work but it will save your survivors a lot of grief and as we know from experience possibly a legal fight.

LAST BUT NOT LEAST, TELL YOUR FAMILY ABOUT YOUR ASSOCIATION AND LEAVE THEM A LIST OF FOLKS TO CONTACT WHEN THEY SAY GOODBY TO YOU. We now hear about most deaths through someone who happens to see their obituary. We can, and often do help widows get through the bureaucracy they face in their time of grief. We will help your family and if we know in time we will arrange for your fellow intruders to attend your service.

I would be remiss if I did not tell you about the loss of our dear friend and Honorary Member, Mary Ellen Nabors who was laid to rest in Arlington on Jan 31st. Mary Ellen is the sister of Tommy Condrey, MIA, whose 70th birthday is Feb. 12. 2014. Mary Ellen was a tireless crusader in our struggle to locate and bring our 10 missing intruders home. She was one of the only Intruder relatives to still make the annual trip to DC to meet with the DOD folks and to let them know that we still care. She shall be missed and remembered.

More on #113.....

For those not on the net 113 has recently been retired from the FL National Guard and awarded to the H.E.A.R.T.S., Veterans Museum in Huntsville, TX, all thanks to Intruder Ed Duke.

113 was one of the second pair of H-Models the 281st AHC received in January 1968. I was assigned 113 as the first crew chief. It was on many Delta missions, lead ship in the rescue in the Valley of the Tigers, it had twin M 60's on some of the Delta's and was coming out of the hole when Donald McCoig was KIA, the only 281st KIA in 1968.

113 is currently at Lance Ham's cattle ranch waiting to be moved to Huntsville, TX. With the Associations donation plus other member donations along with Ed Duke's scrounging, arm twisting, and begging it will be restored to its original appearance with 281 on the front doors for ground level display only (not flyable) condition. Several other Intruders have helped with parts and donations.

I want to thank ED, the Executive Board and all those who are helping with this project. Several combat era photos of 113 have been prepared for donation to the Museum. As much history about 113 and its missions and crews as we can gather will be given to the museum for them to display and put on their web site. Any members that crewed, or have stories related to 113 please forward them to Ed, myself or the Museum to be part of the history of this aircraft.

I have learned from the Museum that most aircraft on display at museum have very little history other than what war it was in. From what the H.E.A.R.T.S. Museum already has on 113 they have said this could well be the most documented Viet Nam era helicopter. All donations to the Museum are tax deductible.
