Special Operation Plaque - Update

Our request to have an in ground plaque placed in the US Army Special Operations Command Memorial Plaza has finally completed the approval process, and in late January we received final approval from the Secretary of the Army. The granite marker has now been ordered and should delivered by late March or early April.

The Meadows Field Memorial Plaza is located outside of the headquarters building of the Special Operations Command at Ft. Bragg, NC. The Plaza contains stones dedicated to past and current Army Special Operations forces, and the 281st has been designated the US Army's First Special Operations Helicopter Company. There are thirty stones currently in the plaza, and ours will be placed beside the marker for Project Delta.

An official dedication ceremony conducted by the US Army Special Operations Command (USASOC), supported by the US Army Special Operations Aviation Command (USASOAC), the 160th SOAR, is now tentatively scheduled for early June of this year at Ft. Bragg. Our stone will be officially unveiled at the ceremony by the Commanding General of USASOC, and there will be many other high-ranking officers in attendance including the Commanding General of USASOAC. Other distinguished guests will also be in attendance. Plans are to have an Army Band, a bag piper, and tents will be provided for all guests, plus a bus for our transportation on Post. All members of the 281st AHC Association, Inc. and family and guests will be invited to attend the ceremony. We also expect several retired members of Project Delta and Special Forces who live in the Fayetteville area to attend.

Additional details including hotel accommodations, and etc. will be forthcoming once we get a final date from the Army. This is a

once in a lifetime event, and a significant chapter in the history of the 281st Assault Helicopter Company, its predecessor, and attached units. For now, make plans to attend if you are able, to show our pride and support for the legacy we created in Special Operations Aviation.

I will be the point of contact for the Association, and Walt Pikul is the POC with the Army. Anyone with any questions can contact either of us.

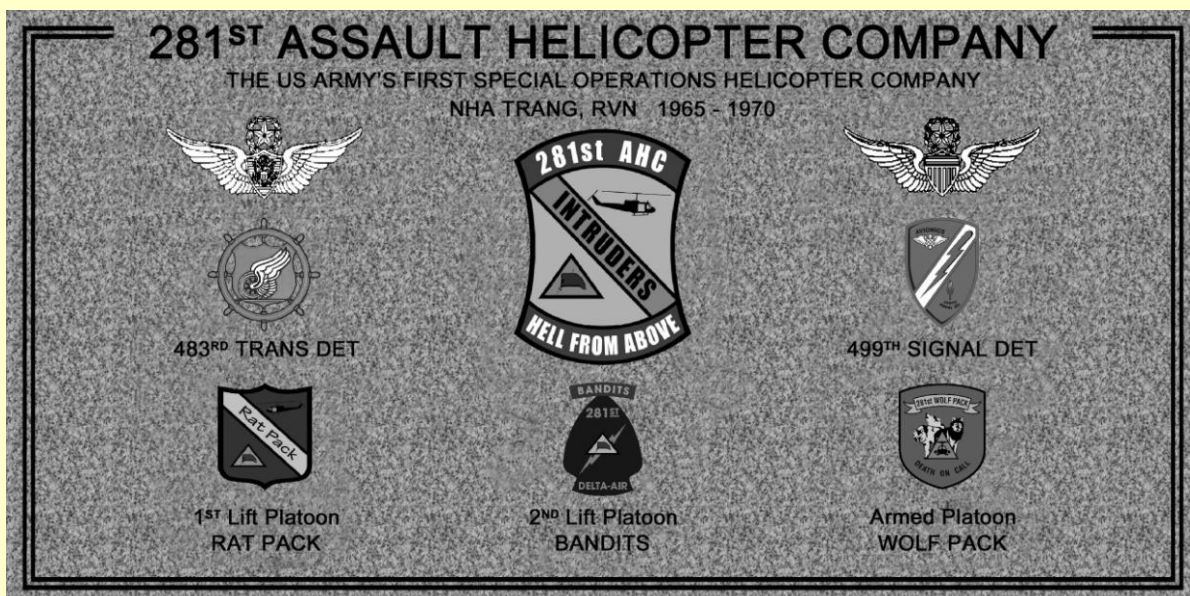
To Close..... from the Editor
